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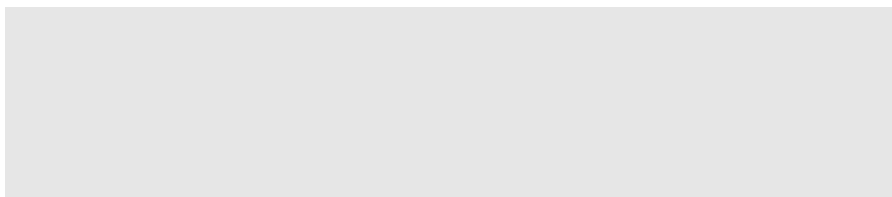
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## 1. PUBLIC SECTOR PROCUREMENT OF TEXTILES<sup>1</sup>

### 1.1 Introduction

The August 2000 clothing and textile sector jobs' summit stated the following in connection with the public sector procurement:

*“The parties recognise that policies aimed at influencing buying behaviour of large procurers (e.g. the state) retailers, and consumers in favour of local producers can play a role in increasing domestic output and hence of maintaining and increasing local employment. Such policies need to be part of measures aimed at addressing price, quality and delivery time, which are addressed in the section on generic strategies. Each of the parties has a role to play in fostering ‘buy local’ policies.*

- *Government and Parastatals will seek to maximise local purchasing of clothing and textile products through the public procurement system (at national, provincial and local government levels) through the following mechanisms which will be in place for a three year period:*
  - ❑ *All goods available locally will be granted additional price preferences and that specifications are designed in such a manner that local producers are not disadvantaged.*
  - ❑ *Local suppliers will need to certify that they respect worker rights, and do not engage in disguised employment relationships such as the ‘independent contractor’ arrangements.”*



### 1.2 Government Purchases

#### 1.2.1 Government Term Contracts

- “Term” contracts are always managed by the staff of the State Tender Board;
- This staff arranges the meetings to set the tender specifications; places the advert in the State Tender Bulletin; controls the evaluation of the tenders received; processes the tender through the national state tender board; finally, it concludes the contract with the successful tenderer(s);
- Usually a “term” contract lasts for a period of no longer than 2 years;
- Generally, all central government departments participate in these contracts – a few of the provinces (who participate on a voluntary basis); and the SANDF ((the army, the air force, the navy, and the medical services) which has the option of procuring via Armskor). The payment for the goods is made from the budget of the Department requiring the goods;
- Some government departments who acquire goods off this list then – if they are not buying a finished product – put out further tenders for the beneficiation of the products that they have purchased (see section 2.2. below). For example:

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<sup>1</sup> Textiles mean fabrics, household textiles and industrial (agricultural textiles).

- the SANDF will put out many smaller tenders for the CMT of the fabrics that it has bought on term tenders for clothing
- Correctional Services may either put out some CMT contracts to convert the fabric into clothing; or it will use the fabric (or leather) in the prison workshops (which convert the fabric into prisoners uniforms / shoes<sup>2</sup>);
- Some of the individual items required in terms of “term” tender are of such a volume that the suppliers have to supply the product in “instalments”. E.g. the 980 000m of orange fabric required by correctional services under the current contract is split between a number of textile factories each of whom has to supply a specified number of meters per month;

- THE SABS IS GENERALLY INVOLVED IN THE SETTING OF THE SPECIFICATIONS OF EACH TERM TENDER. THE SABS MAY DO AN ASSESSMENT OF WHETHER EACH FACTORY IS CAPABLE OF SUPPLYING THE PRODUCTS. SACTWU MUST SUPPORT THIS SYSTEM;
- ANNEXURE “A” DETAILS FACTS RELATING TO GOVERNMENT TERM TEXTILE TENDERS.

#### 1.2.2 MAIN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

- THERE IS A RANGE OF TEXTILE PURCHASES THAT CENTRAL GOVERNMENT MAKES WHICH ARE NOT MADE THROUGH “TERM CONTRACTS”. NATIONAL GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS WHICH ARE SIGNIFICANT PURCHASERS OF THESE PRODUCTS ARE:

- CORRECTIONAL SERVICES : PURCHASES OF : 185 000M ELASTIC; BED COVERS; COTTON FABRIC; CURTAINING; FLAGS; YARN; KNITTED FLEECE FABRIC; POLYESTER AND COTTON FABRIC
- SANDF: PURCHASES OF, WEBBING; ROPE
- PUBLIC WORKS: PURCHASES OF TECHNICAL TEXTILES
- WATER AFFAIRS: PURCHASES OF TECHNICAL TEXTILES
- AGRICULTURE: PURCHASES OF TECHNICAL TEXTILES

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<sup>2</sup> One assumes that the ILO convention on forced labour only affects products that are made by prison labour and which is not put up for sale – these products are for the exclusive end-use by the prison authorities. If this is outlawed in terms of ILO conventions SACTWU would have to consider the options of opposing it. If SACTWU wants to compel Correctional Services to stop this practice – it will significantly affect their budget; accordingly Correctional Services may set tender specifications which will result in imported materials being used (e.g. China).

1.2.3 OTHER LEVELS OF PROCUREMENT

- THERE ARE TEXTILE PURCHASES AT PROVINCIAL AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT LEVELS. IT IS THOUGHT THAT MOST OF THESE PURCHASES ARE INSIGNIFICANT RELATIVE TO THE NATIONAL TENDERS.

1.2.4 UNCERTAINTY WITH WAY GOVERNMENT WILL DO PROCUREMENT

- GOVERNMENT IS REVAMPING THE PROCUREMENT SYSTEM. ITS INTENTION IS TO DECENTRALISE TENDERING TO DEPARTMENTAL LEVELS. DEPARTMENTS WILL MOST PROBABLY BE ABLE TO SET TENDER PREFERENCE THEMSELVES.
- SACTWU WILL COMMENCE DISCUSSIONS WITH THE LARGER GOVERNMENT PURCHASERS WITH REGARDS THEM SETTING POLICIES THAT THEY WILL ONLY BUY LOCALLY MADE TEXTILES
- THIS WILL SUPPORT THE AGREEMENT OF THE DTI, REACHED AT THE SECTOR JOBS SUMMIT , THAT THEY WILL ENSURE THAT ONLY LOCAL PRODUCTS ARE PURCHASED.

1.3.1 SACTWU WILL SET-UP A WEBSITE ON WHICH ALL TENDERS RELATING WHICH WILL PLACE GOVERNMENT TENDERS RELATING TO THE GOVERNMENT'S TEXTILE REQUIREMENTS.



**ANNEXURE “A”:**        **STATE PROCUREMENT “TERM” CONTRACTS**

**1.        Summary – “Term” tenders affecting the textile industry**

- There are 6 major “term” tenders affecting the textile industries. It is important that SACTWU should monitor the implementation / due dates of each tender.
  
- In the long terms SACTWU should set itself the goal of:
  - Ensuring that as many local companies as possible bid for these contracts
  - Ensuring that any enterprises that are announced as recipients of winning tenders comply with the RSA’s labour laws. For example, the factory must
    - if required, be registered with a relevant Bargaining Council and be up to date with all contributions to those BC
    - be registered for UIF, and be up-to-date with all contributions to the fund
    - be registered with the Compensation Commissioner and be up-to-date with all contributions to the fund
    - comply with all BCEA regulations(SACTWU should debate and set these minimum standards / obligations at a SACTWU NEC)
  
- To achieve the above SACTWU should immediately after the STB meeting inquire as to who won the contract and conduct checks itself.

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1. *Carpets & Carpet Tiles*

- GOVT. DEPT. PARTICIPATION: all national state departments; provinces E Cape, Mpumalanga, N West. Tender controlled by STB.
- DETAILS PREVIOUS TENDER: Tender ran for 2 years. The tender sets the prices of the carpets and includes cost installation. Each state department orders off the contract from any one of the suppliers (depending on what type of carpet they want) at the prices set.
- ESTIMATED QUANTITIES: no one has any idea of how many carpets are used - this is because each govt. dept. can order as it wants. In some cases, like with SAPS, ordering is decentralised – each SAP station can contact a supplier to supply carpets in terms of the contract.

My sense is that this tender was mainly produced by RSA manufacturers

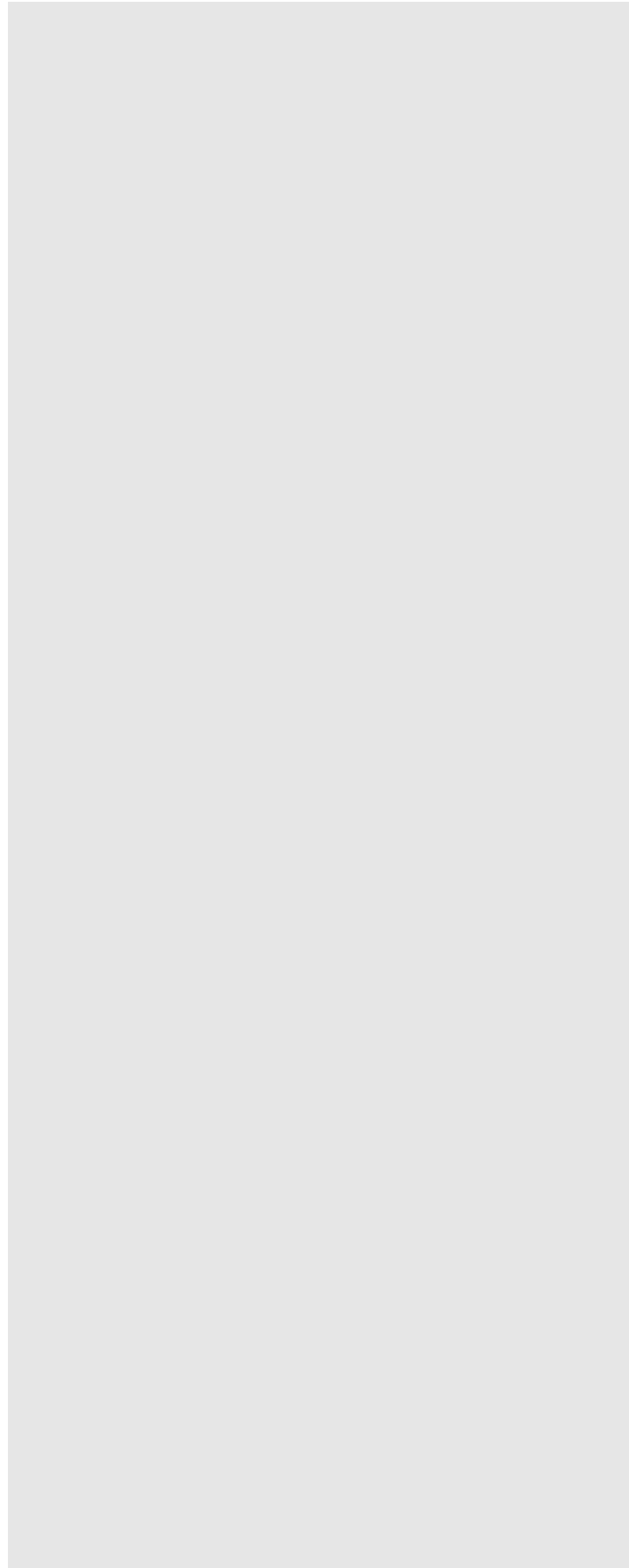
