Topic: A report from Global Financial Integrity estimates illicit financial flows out of Africa due to trade misinvoicing at some US\$50 to US\$60 billion per year. Estimates for South Africa show that it is also a significant issue for the country. The extent of Transfer Pricing and Trade Mispricing can have a significant impact on the fiscus and the resources that countries have available to provide basic services to their citizens. How does Transfer take place? Is it legal or illegal? Is it more prevalent in particular industries?

The focus of this seminar will be to draw on both local and international expertise in order to better understand this issue and its relevance for South Africa.
